




What is Mission?

- □ The word "Mission" does not appear in the Bible
- Latin "Mittere" translates Greek "apostello" to send



- What is Mission?
 - A Sender
 - Someone who is sent
 - Someone to whom they are sent
 - A task to accomplish

Andreas Kostenberger defines mission as: "Mission is the specific task which a person or group seeks to accomplish."

Baptism

- The first outward sign of discipleship
- "Teaching them to observe all that I commanded you."
 - □ The **content and practice** of discipleship

- A Disciple:
 - □ **Believer** \rightarrow Heart \rightarrow Believing \rightarrow **Baptism**
 - □ Learner → Mind → Learning → "teaching all that I commanded you"
 - □ Follower \rightarrow Will \rightarrow Living \rightarrow "to observe"

C.S. Lewis said, "The Church exists to draw men into Christ to make them little Christs."


- The book of Acts is the demonstration of the church's mission





The Progress of the Great Commission

- The Task of the Great Commission: To win individuals for Christ from every people group, not just from every nation
 - "nations" = "ethne" (i.e. ethnicities or people groups)

- V 20: "and lo, I am with you always, even to the end of the age."
 - A fulfillment of Matthew 1:23: "Behold, the virgin shall be with child and shall bear a Son, and they shall call His name Immanuel," which translated means, "God with us."
