1. Did Jesus have any women disciples?
2. Can you think of women in the Bible or church history who played a big role in what God is doing in this world? How?

Mid-Sermon:

But, instead of having you simply focus on listening for an outline, I want to give you some important ideas to listen for. So, as you come to the service, bring a piece of paper and a pen, and see if you can answer these questions as I preach.

1. What are some reasons people get upset about what the Bible teaches about women?
2. What is ironic about people getting upset about that?
3. What two proofs did we give that Jesus thought about women differently than his culture?
4. What is the connection between the sinful woman in Luke 7:36-50 and Luke 7:35?
5. Luke 8:1-3 is a summary statement about Jesus' ministry. What three things does it tell us about it?
6. What is the focus of this passage?
7. Who were the women he mentions?
8. What did you learn about them?
9. What is Luke telling us about the relationship of these women to Jesus?
10. What would have been difficult about having Mary Magdalene as a disciple? What challenges would Joanna have faced in following Jesus?
11. What can we learn from Jesus as a church about how we as a church can reflect his attitude toward women?
