

Sermon Series: Church Matters

Sermon Text: Hebrews 10:19-25 part 2

Sermon Title: A SINGULAR DELIGHT

Main Idea:

The passage from Hebrews 10:19-25 emphasizes the importance of corporate worship and the believer's responsibilities within the church. The writer calls Christians to draw near to God, hold fast to their faith, and encourage one another. This message argues that corporate worship is a God-ordained means for believers to commune with Him, strengthen their faith, and express their love for God and each other. We will see the significance of preparing one's heart for worship, valuing it as a priority, and recognizing the privilege of gathering as a church.

Discussion Questions:

- What is happening in Hebrews 10:19-25? What are the two "parts" to these verses?
- What are the three responsibilities that we find in this text?
- How does seeing with the "eyes of faith" change our perspective on the significance of corporate worship?
- How does the imagery of the Old Testament priesthood help us understand our access to God through Christ?
- What are some reasons to think that "drawing near" in this passage applies to corporate worship?
- How does corporate worship differ from individual worship, and why are both important?
- What do you think is the typical Christian attitude toward corporate worship?
- Was there anything in this message that challenged your own view of corporate worship?
- What are some obstacles in modern culture that make prioritizing corporate worship difficult?
- What does this passage teach us about how we should worship together as believers?
- What practical steps can believers take to prepare their hearts for worship?
- What does he mean by coming in full assurance of faith? Knowing what we are doing as we draw near to God, how is it possible for us to do that?
