Sermon Title: "A Missionary Psalm"

Sermon Text: Psalm 67

Pre-Sermon: This is to help you prepare for hearing from God's Word.

- Please take some time to pray that God would strengthen the preacher to speak accurately and you to listen eagerly to His Word.
- Quickly read Psalm 65 68. What are some ideas that are repeated in these psalms?
- Read Psalm 67 again out loud. What are some of the words that are repeated in this psalm? What do you think might be the main point?

Sermon Discussion Questions: This will help you think through the passage and what you heard in the message.

- What passage would you go to if you were going to talk about missions from the New Testament?
- What about if you were going to talk about missions from the Old Testament?
- What passage in Luke indicates that Jesus believed the church's mission to the nations was founded on the Old Testament?
- In what "book" of the Psalms is this Psalm located? What is happening in that particular "book" of the Psalms?
- When was this Psalm often read?
- What are the writers doing in the Psalms that we can miss if we rush too quickly to apply it to our own situation?
- What is a chiasm and what does it have to do with this psalm?
- What text of the Old Testament is he paraphrasing in verse 1? What did you learn about that text and its connection to this psalm?
- What is the significance of the word 'that' in verse 2?
- What is the covenant that verse 2 is expanding and explaining?
- What does he want Israel to want?
- What is one of the big differences between the way mission in the Old Testament worked for Israel and how it does for us?
- Why does he bring up the earth in verse 6? What is the connection between this and the book of Deuteronomy? How would a good harvest given Israel hope for the future?
- Living when we do now, we know Israel failed to keep their end of the covenant. But does that mean this psalm has 'failed?' What evidence do we have that God actually has shown mercy and answered this prayer? And how does that give us hope for the future?

• We ended the message by thinking about the mission of the church and its connection to the mission of Israel. What did we say was the reason the church exists?

Sermon Outline: A sermon is much more than an outline, but perhaps this outline will help you follow the sermon.

I want us to look at a passage of Scripture today where the author sought to help Israel understand and remember their role in God's mission and to pray for the salvation of the nations.

- 2. Verses 3-5: The hope for the nations
- 3. Verses 6-7: The future for the planet

Sermon Goal: This is a VERY short explanation of what this message is about and what I'm praying God will achieve through this message.

I want to encourage and challenge and excite you about the mission God's given us as a church by helping you understand God's plan for Israel.
