Luke 9:21-22: God's Plan

### Pre-Sermon:

1. Read Luke 9:18-27.
2. What is the most surprising thing about this passage for you?

### Mid-Sermon:

1. What three questions is Luke answering in this passage?
2. If someone asked you what is most important for them to know about Jesus what would you tell them?
3. What does Luke want us to know about Jesus at the beginning of his gospel?
4. What is the problem we face when talking to be people about Jesus as the Christ and how is that problem different than the one Jesus faced as he was talking with his apostles in Luke about being the Messiah?
5. Why does Jesus tell the apostles not to tell anyone that He is the Messiah?
6. What kind of Messiah were people expecting?
7. Why does Jesus say Son of Man instead of Messiah as he explains what He must do?
8. What four things did Jesus say needed to happen for Him to do His work as Messiah?
9. Why is the word must so important in Jesus' explanation?
10. Where does the Old Testament say the suffering and death and resurrection of Jesus must happen?
11. What are some patterns in the Old Testament that lead us to expect a death and resurrection type event?
12. What are the passages we talked about?
13. What are some other ways we see that this kind of death and resurrection is necessary from the Old Testament?
14. What are two reasons the apostles and others didn't see this?

This passage in Luke is very important because he is clearly showing us who Jesus is, what Jesus came to do and how He came to do it. In order to see the way Luke answers those questions, we are going to look at:

1. **The confession: (v.18-20)**
2. **The warning: (v.21)**
3. **The explanation: (v.22)**
