Date: August 17, 2025 **Passage:** Psalm 139:17-24

Title: Living Intentionally with the Inescapable God

What is the main thing to know?

Beholding God as infinite and personally concerned with us motivates us to live differently. When we discover new depths of God's intentionality towards us, we should pursue new depth in living intentionally for Him. We grow to have that perspective in the same way David did—Beholding God's kingdom plans in the Scriptures. The key way we must change is regarding our relationship to God vs. sin and the world.

What is the main thing to do?

Work hard to determine what we are beholding most—either God, or ourselves and this world.

What is the flow of the message?

- (1.1) Introduction: Recalling verses 1-16, and moving ahead
 - (1.2) Verse 17: God's Intentions towards David are precious...
 - o (1.3) ...because of God's infinite attentiveness towards him (verses 1-6)

 - (1.6) Sharing David's response: Pursuing new depths of intentional living.
