Sermon Text: Luke 16:14-18 **Sermon Title:** Two Master Disaster

Main Idea:

Jesus gives us a huge warning in Luke 16:13. It is impossible to serve two masters! Sometimes though, we try. In Luke 16:14-18, Jesus gives us an illustration of what can happen if we don't take his warning seriously and try to serve God and money at the same time.

- 3. How seriously do you take the threat of becoming greedy? Why might someone be tempted not to take it very seriously?
- 4. What is Luke 16:14-18 doing in the context here?
- 5. How do the Pharisees illustrate the dangers of greed and idolatry in this passage?
- 6. When you find yourself becoming angry when someone is sharing biblical truth what should it cause you to do?
- 7. How do greed and idols sometimes produce false confidence? How does that kind of false confidence reveal itself in this passage?
- 8. How can wealth and prosperity act as spiritual anesthetics?
- 9. Why is apathy considered a dangerous spiritual condition in the context of this sermon?
- 10. How does the reference to divorce in verse 18 fit into the broader message of Luke 16?
- 11. What practical steps can Christians take to guard their hearts against the love of money and maintain their relationship with God?
