In Luke 17, Jesus told us judgment is coming.

In Luke 18, he's showing us the kind of people that are going to be saved from it and the kind of people who won't.

5 different stories...




I) A Pharisee and tax collector



2) Parents and babies



3) A rich young ruler



4.)A blind beggar



5.) Zaccheaus

...one theme: HOW SALVATION WORKS

WHY DOES THIS TOPIC MATTER?

Because the stakes are so high and we naturally get the answer wrong!

Even though the Bible is very clear, we still want to depend on ourselves!

In Luke 18...

Jesus shows us that no one will be justified by their own performance!

If we want to enter the kingdom, we must come to Jesus like babies, depending solely on Him for blessing!

EXTRICH, YOUNG PULL

BUT WHAT ABOUT SOMEONE WON'T?

He seemed like a person who had absolutely every possible advantage... and yet, he is unable to experience salvation!

WHAT WAS HE MISSING?

He wasn't willing to depend completely on Jesus!

When we start to see how important this kind of humbling is, being saved can begin to seem impossible...AND THAT'S THE WHOLE POINT!

TRULY BEING SAVED REQUIRES A MIRACLE THAT ONLY GOD CAN DO!

Take action!

If that miracle hasn't happened in your life...

you need it and you need to plead with God to do what you cannot.

If that miracle has happened in your life...

you need to be thankful! There is no sacrifice you can make for Jesus that is bigger than the blessing He has in store for those who do. We can be absolutely confident about that because Jesus isn't asking us to do anything He hasn't already done.

We are saved by the Son of God humbling Himself and trusting God's promises by going to the cross. And while that was difficult, we know what happened next.

Jesus' story didn't end with humiliation. He was crucified, died and was buried. But then He rose again, ascended to heaven, and was glorified.
